Early intervention & Early Education

Early Intervention and early education programme involves identifying/screening children with different disabilities in the age group of 0-6 years, providing necessary intervention after proper assessment. Empowering parents to enable them to deal with the special needs of their disabled child and creating awareness amongst various stakeholders for ensuring the functional, developmental and coping abilities of children.

Target group: The disabled children below the age of 6 belonging to economically weaker sections of the community.



Smart Goal: To strengthen the ecosystem for early stage intervention and early education (EI & EE) for 454 children with disabilities/development delays of Kalaburagi Taluk and 3 PHC Hoonkirangi, Farhatabad, Savalgi, Nandoor, Shrinivassardagi, Sanoor, between the age group of 0-6 years and the relevant stakeholders through therapeutic and support services.



Objective of Early Intervention: To identify disability in minimum 450 children between 0 - 6 year old, assist them with identification of disability, assess them, and to rehabilitate them in order to mitigate the effects of disability to lead an independent life as they grow.

Objectives:

1. Identification of 454 children with disabilities
2. To provide assistance in surgeries, medicine, physiotherapy and speech and hearing therapy.
3. To Provide Assistive devices (Aids and Appliances).
4. To reduce the impact of disability and to live independently.
5. To bring changes in Child and the attitude of the Parents.



6. To provide education by fostering inclusive education.
7. To facilitate Govt. entitlements
8. To create awareness among parents, students and people about the causes of Disability, Rights and entitlements of Disabled persons.

Focus: The focus of the project is to provide early intervention to the young children with developmental delay and other disabilities. Besides this speech therapy, physical therapy, corrective surgeries, Occupational Therapy, psychological and audiology services would be provided as an integral part of this programme. Basic education and various coping strategies will be imparted to the children from 3-6 years in order to enrol them to the mainstream schools and get adjusted to the school environment.

Physiotherapy

Besides this, families especially the parents and care givers are helped to gain control over their lives and develop their capacity to meet the emerging needs of their children and to promote development. All the other stakeholders in the community will be made aware of the needs of such children and necessary links to be utilized in providing service to these children and their families.

Activities

- Identification of 10,032 Children through door to door survey.
- Assessment of the Child with disability to classify the disability.
- Counselling to Parents about the Disability and their roles and responsibilities.
- Assessment for Medical Help like Surgeries, Medicine, Physiotherapy, Hearing and Speech Therapy etc
- Surgeries and Medical Help
- Home/ community based Physiotherapy, Hearing and Speech Therapy
- 15 Children received the assistive devices.
- Training on using and servicing the Assistive devices
- Growth assessment.
- Awareness in communities, schools, colleges, about the causes of disability and prevention.
- Training for ASHAs, Anganwadi Staff and ANMs, VRW, MRW, about the Early Intervention program and their role.
- Trainings for parents on how to cope up with the disabled Children.



Achievement

- We surveyed Gulbarga urban area and successfully visited 383 Anganwadis.
- 454 children were identified and registered.
- 196 children were given reassessment.
- 15 children received Aids and appliances from our centre.
- 322 Anganvadi workers and other stakeholders were trained on early identification.
- We setup a Centre in the prominent place and equipped it with various materials for Stimulation Activities.
- 2653 Home Based Stimulation Activities were conducted.
- 801 Centre based Stimulation Activities were conducted.
- 1 Child underwent surgery.
- 8 Bank Accounts were opened.
- 23 Meetings were conducted for the Parents.
- 15 Children benefited from Measurement camp.
- 12 Children benefited from Medical Camp.
- 10 Vanamahotsav programmes were conducted.
- 148 New Children were identified.
- 25 Children received Niramaya.
- 29 Children received Disability Card.
- 10 Children received scholarship.
- Collaboration with other projects. We extended our services to the rural areas of Kalaburagi Taluk.
- 250 participated in World Disable day programme
- A scholarship of Rs. 5000/- per child was received by 15 children from DDW office totalling Rs.75,000/-.



Success story



Sneha, a girl child was born on 22/12/ 2019, the first of the 2 children of Mr.Krishana and Mrs. Sujata a poor couple from HagrundagiVillage Kalaburgi. The child Sneha was 5 years. From the birth she was unable to talk and she could not go to the Anganwadi. She remained aloof. At that time Seva Sangama EI & EE animator visited their home and gave the parents awareness about the possibility of speech recovery through speech activity. The parents of the child cooperated and with the effort of both staff of Seva Sangama and parents Sneha is able to speak a few words. She is going to Anganwadi and is very active. She received UDID card and pension. She is mingling with the children of her age group. Her parents were informed to take part in the home based activities which are conducted by EI& EE team. With the support of the parents and intervention of SSDS staff the child's condition is improving and the parents of the child very grateful to SSDS and the staff for their support which has shown results in their child.



UJJIVANA PROJECT PHASE III 2024 -2025

Goal: Fostering and securing self –sustaining climate resilient agriculture. Livelihood through community –owned processes in the state of West Bengal, Karnataka, and Telangana (Hyderabad) Phase III'

Ujjivana Project Phase III: With the financial support of Miserior, Germany, Seva Sangama implements the said Project since January 2022 in 10 villages of Kalaburgi Taluk with the aim of empowering the owners of small and (5 acres) and to motivate the farmers to adopt modern agriculture practices, and climate resilient agricultural practices. It envisages in providing technical support for eligible small land holding farmers to access various agro –based government schemes and benefits. During the present project period (January 2022 to December 2024) we have mobilized various Government agricultural schemes for farmers owning small land through the awareness and training programs conducted on various activities. There were 8074 beneficiaries from 10 Villages, 5 Panchayats, and 2 Hobalies in Kalaburgi Taluk of Kalaburgi District

Outcome 1 - Empowered communities in the program areas have demonstrated community-led actions through local governance and improved their livelihood.

In 2024, 40 members of the Self-Help Group (SHG) in Udnoor applied for MGNREGA cards. As of July 2024, 38 out of the 40 members have received their MGNREGA cards.



- International Earth Day was celebrated in Sitnoor and Farthabad villages with the participation of 86 farmers. Out of these, 12 farmers practiced soil and water management techniques.
- At the KVK Training Center, 16 beneficiaries and U3 staff participated in the seeds storage training.
- U3 Grama Panchayat Village Information notice boards were upgraded in 8 villages.
- The Ujjivana Program's community Implementer & educators visited 188 farmers to raise awareness about the issues associated with using chemical fertilizers and the benefits of organic farming. They also provided information on agricultural practices and rainwater harvesting techniques.
- Fourteen farmers have planted Marigold, sun flowers and rose flowers around their fields to increase income and aid in pesticide removal. This practice has resulted in an additional monthly income of Rs.6, 000/- per farmer.
- 176 families participated in Grama Sabha meeting and discussed home allotments. 6 order copies received.
- Horticulture Department officers visited 4 farmers to provide crop mulching subsidies. Each unit cost Rs.16, 000/-, resulting in a total benefit amount of Rs. 64,000/-.
- 2 new farmers' groups were formed with total 20 farmers
- 4 New SHGs were formed with 60 members. Farmers groups came to know about Village level Banks, Schemes, and other facilities and they applied for the loan for lower interest. Bank accounts were opened for 2 new SHGs.
- There was Formation & Strengthening of 2 new Village Planning Committees with 40 members each.
- 245 beneficiaries have applied for linking their Aadhaar cards with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI)."
- Celebrated district level International Women's Day in Gulbarga. 255 women from working area participated. 10 women were honoured during the program for their achievement in different fields.
- Jyoti, a member of the SHGs association, was informed that Dharmasthala got a solar system roti-making machine through a subsidy of Rs.40, 000/- from SHGs.



- 4 training programmes were conducted for 105 people on animal husbandry. 16 members started it. With Milk and curd sales every month they earn Rs.7000/-yearly 84,000.)
- 4 Linkage meetings with Government departments 1 agriculture department, 2-gramPanchayat. Total 75 participants 6 farmers were informed about applying for the Krushi Bagya Yojana scheme.
- 6 training programmes were organized on Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana. Seventy-four families received free gas connections under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana. Each connection costing Rs.6, 000/-, resulting in a total benefit amount of Rs.4, 44,000/.
- There were 4meetings for farmers and SHG members in which they were given off-farm training on different schemes. They were encouraged to start off -farm activities like goat rearing, poultry farming and dairy farming. 12 of them took op goat rearing, 6 of them poultry farming and 8 of them dairy farming. altogether 26 farmers are involved in the off farm activities. Their monthly income is Rs. 6500/-yearly Rs.1, 56000 /- benefits.
- SC/ST social welfare department schemes for livelihood applications were submitted by 24 families. Women's application submitted for 80% subsidy loan for selfemployment.
- Two days of poultry farming trainings were conducted at the Animal Husbandry Department, in which 18 beneficiaries and two U3 staff members participated. Certificates for animal husbandry training were received by our 18 beneficiaries.
- At the KVK Training Centre, 16 beneficiaries and U3 staff participated in the seeds storage training."
- The program implementer and community educator visited Canara Bank and Union bank where they opened new bank accounts and passbooks for 2 SHGs. They also collected information on the schemes available at the bank for SHGs and farmers, including those offering low interest rates.
- There was a discussion in a meeting with the vice president of Gram Panchyath about the 5% budget allocation for disabled individuals in Sitnoor and Nandikor villages.
- A community leader from Udnoor village cleaned the Anganwadi premises and the internal drainage system.
- On World Environment Day, awareness about cleanliness was raised in Dharmapur village. 22 People volunteered to clean the public area around the Beerlingshwar temple.
- Through the PlantationDrive, Community Forest was identified at Dharmapur village and at Nandikorvillage.



Outcome 2: The community-led dialogue with poor, duty bearers and nature intensified in the program areas for social, economic and environmental sustainability

- Helping the farmers by getting swing machines from the agriculture department in Sitnoor village. 44 farmers applied and 06 farmers received machines from RSK Kalaburagi.

The cost of the machine is 1,00,000/- . RSK department provided the machines with subsidy at 50% that is Rs.50,000/-.



- Information about the facilities available in the Agriculture Department was provided at the Farmer Contact Centre. A total of 46 applications were submitted, and 22 farmers received sprinkler pipes. Each farmer received a subsidy of Rs.18,000/-, amounting to a total subsidy of Rs.2,80,000/-.



- Under the KVK program, through our U3 project distributed 12 types of seeds to 60 farmers. The cost of one unit of seeds was Rs.400/-, totalling Rs.24000/-.

- Under the Pradhan Mantri Bhima Suraksha Yojana (PMBSY), 118 people applied for life insurance coverage, the cost of instalment per year was Rs.20/-.

- Information about the schemes of the Construction Workers Department was provided, and 15 people participated in the program. Six individuals submitted applications for various schemes, including laptops for the children of construction workers. As a result, two children received laptops, each costing Rs.28,000/-, totalling a benefit amount of Rs.56,000/-.



- A discussion on the community forest was held with the Nandikur village Gram Panchayat PDO, led by the Director of Seva Sangama.

- After visiting the Anganwadi centre in Sitanur village and observing that the door and fan needed to be repaired, an application was submitted to the Nandikur Gram Panchayat officials for the necessary maintenance.



- Three beneficiaries received sheets of tarpaulin (RasiTadapatri). Each sheet cost Rs.1,750/-, resulting in a total benefit amount of Rs.5,250/-.

- Three vermin composting bins were provided, each costing Rs.6,000/-, resulting in a total cost of Rs.18,000/-.



- The SKG Institute installed Gobar Gas Units for 6 beneficiaries. Each unit cost Rs.30,000/-, totalling a benefit amount of Rs.1,80,000/-. The beneficiaries were: Kabul Patel, Siddappa, Sharnukumar, Mallappa Swamy, Kesva Patil and Shantappa Natikar.



- 88 farmers have linked their E-KYC and subsequently received the PM-Kisan amount. Each farmer received Rs.6,000, resulting in a total benefit of Rs.5,28,000/-.

- (FID) 184 people were registered for new Farmer Identify Card.

- 18 farmers received information on kitchen gardens, and among them, 8 are cultivating vegetables for their own use.

- Swachh Barath Abhiyan Scheme was introduced and 165 members from Nandikor and Dharmapur village applied for it and 72 applications were approved and work order copy received under General Category by 27, each amounting Rs. 12,000/-, and under Scheduled Caste by 45 each amounting Rs. 20,000/-. Total benefits received Rs.12,24,000/-.



- 145 beneficiaries have applied for linking their Aadhaar cards with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI).

- The program implementer and community educator visited Sitnoor village and provided information to 8 farmers about securing a good price for onions. The price is Rs.2,200/- per quintal, totalling Rs.1,62,800/- for 74 quintals.

- U3 staff visited the land of 18 farmers and provided information on horticultural department schemes. Six farmers received an onion subsidy, totalling Rs. 1,44,000 (6 farmers' × 2,400/- each).

- Millet farming and volunteer training were held at Honkirnagi village, with participation of 46 SHG members and 6 volunteers, totalling 52 attendees.

- U3 staff informed about the Karnataka State Government's crop compensation program for farmers. Compensation of Rs.2,000/- was provided to 122 farmers. However, funds for 66 farmers were stopped due to issues with NPCI and Aadhaar linkage. For the remaining farmers, 2 new accounts were opened."

- 4 Skill Development training programmes were organized for low-income groups in which 75 members participated and got awareness about , tailoring, embroidery & making sambar masala. As a result 18 of them have started sale of clothes, embroidery work and they are getting Rs. 400/- per day. Monthly income total 12,000/- rupees. Six beneficiaries received from SBI RSETI certificates for completing the fast food making training.

- According to the Government of Karnataka's order, every farmer in Sitanur village was informed about the mandatory linking of Aadhaar cards and PAN cards. Out of the 84 farmers who participated, 52 successfully linked their Aadhaar cards and PAN cards."

- Solar energy Systems were established for 9 farmers.
- Mr. Anand a farmer started organic dragon fruit farming in 2 acres of lands in Nandur K village. The farmer's name is Mallakappa from Nandur K. He practices mixed farming with 1.5 acres dedicated to bajra crops.
- Chandrasha Biradar, a farmer from Udnoor Village under the Revival Program, stored cow dung collected over one year and sold it for 36,000 rupees. Shivananda from Paratabad village bought it.
- Information about the facilities available in the Agriculture Department was provided at the Farmer Contact Centre. Twenty-eight applications were submitted, and two farmers received water ponds. Each unit cost 86,000 rupees, totalling Rs.1, 72,000/-.
- 16 farmers are practicing seed storage.
- 6 programs were conducted and 130 members got information on how to find out about community issues through cross learning
- 45 of them got awareness on kitchen garden. Among them 18 are cultivating vegetables in their own surroundings.
- 5 meetings were organized for underprivileged/ marginalized people to have a dialogue with Govt. officers. 40 members participated and 2 members applied for govt. facilities like PM Avas Yojana and Indira Avas Yojana Schemes(Rs.180,000/- per head)
- 5 Interface meetings were organized between GP, SHG members and farmers. 88 members participated and applied for job card, 42 of them received and going for work and each earns Rs. 316/- per day and 12 working days earning Rs.4424/-. Total of Rs.1, 59,264/-.
- Awareness on Integrated Organic Farming was conducted and 72 members participated. 36 of them started vermicompost, Jeeva Amruta, Panchagavya. They earn Rs. 400/- by selling wormy compost soil, and earning monthly income of Rs. 12,000/-).
- 53 farmers have used manure (Tippigober) and cattle manure for agriculture.
- 60 members got awareness on Allied off-farm Activities and 16 farmers started the off-farming.
- 84 members got awareness on post-harvest technologies.
- 76 members got information on the Promotion of appropriate Agronomic practices and 22 started practicing the same.
- 48 farmers are cultivating mixed farming vegetables and they earn Rs. 400/- per day by selling vegetables. Monthly income around Rs.12, 000/- and total income of 48 farmers per month is Rs.1, 44,000/-.



Outcome 3: Volunteers reached out and are engaged in achieving the greatest possible impact of the program,

- Malikarjun a volunteer helped 28 farmers to get 20kg of seeds from the RSK, Agriculture Department. The cost of one unit was Rs.1600/-. Total benefits amounted to Rs.44,800/-.
- Four volunteers managed the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) program, serving 528 members (240 male and 288 female). These members were availed 57 working days each, with a daily wage of Rs.316/-. The total benefits mobilized amounted to Rs.1,05,03,504/-.
- Mr. Basavaraja volunteer from Udnoor village took the initiative to help the elderly to submit applications for old age pensions and there were 16 beneficiaries.
- World Environment Day was celebrated at Udnoor village. A volunteer named Shantgowda distributed 30 saplings, and Shajan Begam assisted for applying for 18 Swatch Bharat Abhiyan applications.
- Six volunteers provided the information about the facilities available in the four Gram Panchayats to the farmers. Thirty-three applications were submitted, and 16 farmers received grants for trenches. The work was done in the Govt. Land which involved 6 volunteers and 3 staff members. The total number of trenches dug was 2021.
- 24 volunteers of Ujjivana from 10 villages visited Animal Husbandry Department, Agriculture Department and other Departments in order to collect information about networking and training and gaining knowledge about government schemes available for the farmers.
- Two volunteers from Dharmapur village cleaned the premises around the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar statue.
- Formation & Strengthening of Village Planning Committees were carried out by Mr. Nagendrappa. The community participated in cleaning the community forest area at Naganhali village.
- Community member KupendraVarma oversaw the reopening of the public toilet at Naganhali village.
- As the teachers in Government Primary school in Sitanur village were often irregular to the classes resulting in negative impact upon the education of the students, volunteers from the revival program

With the financial support of Caritas India, Seva Sangama is implementing the programme as third phase in Kalburgi Taluk. The main objectives of the third phase are to identify new volunteers, to strengthen the existing volunteers and to train them to carry out the task of spreading the cancer awareness in every village of the Diocese.

Goal: A society that mitigates the threat of deadly disease cancer through awareness, early detection, treatment and prevents it by adopting healthy lifestyle in Kalaburagi and Bidar districts.

OBJECTIVES: To make the people aware of the cancer and adopting healthy lifestyle. To establish systematic approaches/ strategies to diagnose treat and prevent cancer To Create a Sustainable approach to be in place for the further cause

Activities

Awareness Programs: 149 Awareness programs were conducted for School children, Women's Groups, farmers' Groups, GP members, village leaders, SHG Members, Anganwadi Teachers, Asha workers, pregnant women and lactating mothers, altogether 5767 members participated and 2347 members got the proper knowledge about the impact of cancer and they are well oriented about the types, the negative impact of cancer, causes, the preventive measures on daily basis, they are well motivated about putting up of the kitchen garden and its benefits, they have been using the kitchen garden, able to grow their organic vegetable/millet, began to eat organic food and their health is improved/ livelihood is developed.



Health campaign programs: 2 camps for health check-up were conducted in which 617 people participated. For one cancer Patient, general medical check-up was done and 5 patients were referred to hospitals like KIDWAI and all the participants were provided with free medicine.



Volunteers Training programs: Volunteers Training programs were conducted for 423 volunteers of various category; like School and College students, YSM leaders, SHG members, Anganwadi Teachers, and Asha Workers, Farmers and animators of Gulbarga Diocese on how to spread the awareness about the types of cancer, the negative impact of cancer, causes and the preventive measures on daily basis, to identify new patients and they were well oriented.



Cancer day Observation: World Cancer Day was celebrated at Gulbarga & Humnabad, to spread Awareness about the types of cancer, the negative impact of cancer, causes and to identify new patients and the preventive measures on daily basis. 450 beneficiaries belonging to various categories have participated and they were given in-depth orientation about the same.



Dental Camp: A dental camp was conducted in Sitnoor village and 2 more were held in St. Mary's school. In all three camps around 700 people and students participated. This was possible with the Collaboration of All Brothers Dental Collage Kalburagi.



Lucky Draw Distribution: We had lucky draw for the Cancer Day. On that day coupons were drawn a student of class 3 of St. Mary's school was lucky to get the 2nd prize.



Resource Mobilization / Fund Raising: Donation coupons were sold out as the local fund-raising activity at different villages of Gulbarga diocese to all the category of people, as a result enabled to collect worth Rs.33, 140/-

Evening Tuition Centre for Slum Children: Seva Sangama has implemented this project in 4 urban slums of Gulbarga. During this reporting period, we have established 4 evening tuition centres consisting of 137 children from 1st standard to 10th standard enrolled. The actual conditions of children in slums are at risk whose parents are daily wage workers hence, cannot pay any individual attention to their children's education as well as their personal growth. At that crucial situation, the project aims at providing holistic and extra coaching support for these vulnerable children in urban slums. Under this project, we have motivated all these children to take part in extracurricular activities like; national and international celebrations, competitions, games and sports, the winners are appreciated and awarded with suitable prizes.

Activities and Achievements:

- The slum children are motivated to take part in various extracurricular activities/ competitions and participate in the following; like speech competitions, drawing competitions, Dance competitions, Singing competition, quiz competition, weekly/Monthly internal assessments, games/ sports and other activities and 137 of them have participated; 10 children received prizes for their best performance in the academics, 12 children secured the prize for speech competition, 20 children got the prize for drawing competition, 6 children were given prize for singing competition, 25 children who were awarded for dance completion and 5 groups were awarded for the overall best performance.
- Birthday Celebrations: Children's Birthdays were celebrated at all centres by imploring God's blessings through prayers and wishes and symbolically by cutting cake.

Republic Day:

- Republic Day was celebrated in all four tuition centres.
- 137 children from the entire 4 tuition centres celebrated Christmas with cultural programs.
125 children and their parents participated in the children's day programme in 4Centres. Dr. Farooq distributed 150 note books to the children.
- 156 parents attended the parents' teacher meeting and were given information on the child rights and tips for healthy life style of children.
- 150 children were distributed note books and other stationary items.
- All the tuition centre children celebrated the new year 2025
- 137 children participated in the Constitution Day celebration and they were motivated about the importance of the constitution day.
- Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Jayanti was celebrated and around 50 children had participated. The children of 4Centres received 76 note books from JaiBheema Group Distributor.
- Arranged one day picnic to the park in Kalaburgi city





WEP- Women in Micro Enterprise/Samruddhi:

Women Empowerment program is merged with the Jana Jagruthi Munch program. The existing SHGs are regularly visited and their records have been checked and updated by the appointed animator. Presently, there are 79 SHG under Seva Sangama in four Talukas. SHG-related training programs and awareness sessions are conducted for women in Kalaburgi, Sedam, Wadi, and Aland.

Goal: Empowering leaders of marginalized communities; Leaders among farmers, leaders among adolescent girls, child leaders, women leaders among SHGs & youth leaders to achieve integrated community development through collaborative social actions in availing Govt. entitlements, promoting nutrition, health & hygiene, and ecology in 15 villages and 6 Panchayats in Sedam Taluk of Kalaburgi District.

Objectives:

1. Train and empower leaders of marginalized communities to help and assist communities to avail jobs under the MGNREGA scheme along with other entitlements in 15 villages and 6 Panchayats in Sedam Taluk of Kalaburgi District through collaborative social actions.
2. Adolescent girls, lactating mothers, and pregnant women to know about sexual and reproductive health, and hygiene to practice the same thus community should be awareness on health issues and to make efforts to access health facilities.

Community Forests, rain water harvesting pits, bore well recharges and nutrition gardens to promote ecology are to be achieved by community leaders.
