The program covers **6500** of women belonging to **488** Self Help Groups (SHGs) in 50 Grama Panchayats in Humnabad, Balki, Bidar, Aurad, Hulsoor, Chitguppa and Basavakalyan taluks of Bidar district. The target groups of the program include rural women and adolescent girls.

## Objectives

- Improve the level of literacy of adolescent girls and women
- Increase the number of trained women in book keeping of Self Help Groups (SHGs) of women
- Strengthen women with knowledge and awareness of basic rights of their own, their families and villages
- Reduce the number of women and adolescent girls with ignorance on nutrition, health and sanitation
- Promote Cluster, Taluq and district level federations for promotion of Leadership, availing entitlements and economic self-sustainability of SHGs
- Educate women on enhancing livelihood through entrepreneurship

### 1. With the Strengthened Wings.....

Khurshid B (47 years) is a member of Taj SHG in Ashraya Colony, Basava Kalyan Taluk. She joined the SHG at its outset eight years ago. She had just lost her husband Abdul Karim and she was at a loss not knowing how to support her big family of nine children and her own elderly and sickly mother. Until the death of her husband, she was confined to home caring for the family. As a widow, she couldn't even think of grieving over her loss due to the heavy responsibilities on her shoulder. Taj SHG was a great support and strength for her at this juncture as the other members encouraged her to face life. The Local Coordinator and the Animator of ORBIT constantly visited and supported her.



Khurshid is an illiterate. She owned only a small tin roofed house and a handloom when her husband died. No land. She began to weave the clothes to support the family. The SHG supported her by issuing loans from the savings to buy material for weaving. Further she got Samrudhi loan through the SHG and bought more materials. Slowly she was able to settle all her daughters in marriage, though she was not able to educate her children much. Sons are yet to get settled. They are going for coolie work.

Presently, she is earning an average of Rs. 400/- to 600/- per day. She is extremely grateful for ORBIT intervention in her life. Being part of Taj SHG has opened a new leaf in her life. From the narrow life within the four walls of her home, she has entered an open arena of social life. It was the forum of members from a mixed community of different religions with support and encouragement for one another achieved this new social life for her. She is a happy and sociable woman today.

### 2. Political empowerment through Self Help Group

Gopamma wife of Dasarath is 50 years old elected President of Nirna Grama Panchayat. She hails from a poor family. She has four children - three daughters and a son. She is an illiterate woman. She and Dasarath worked hard to meet the ends of their family. They had a plot of land where they used to cultivate and support the family. Other than that, they depended on coolie work to sustain the family. Life was very hard for Gopamma and family. She





worked for daily food. The income was too less. They felt very difficult to manage the family affairs. They were 6 members in the family. The needs and expenditure were more. She could not educate her children due to financial constraints. She settled her daughters taking loans from others.

Gopamma joined Nainadevi SHG when it was formed by ORBIT. Though illiterate, being a courageous woman, she was elected as the President of the SHG. She began to save a little from her hard earned money with great difficulty. She could take loans from the savings in SHG as well as from Bank through SHG when need arose. She obtained the labour card with the help of the animator. It helped her to get Rs.50,000/- for the marriage expenses of her son.

She participated in many trainings and awareness programmes organized by ORBIT staff. It empowered her socially and economically. The sessions on Panchayati raj and Leadership helped her especially to develop her knowledge as well as leadership capacity.

She contested in the gram panchayat election in 2015 with the support of her SHG, animator and others. She won the election and became the President of Nirna Gram panchayat in Humnabad Taluq. She served as President for 3 years and the rest of the years as member of her ward. Through her committed service to the Panchayat, Gopamma made Nirna Panchayat as Model Panchayat during her Presidentship. She implemented many projects in the villages, such as housing, CC road, sewage, toilets, etc. She visited the anganwadis and schools and solved problems related to anganwadis and schools. Personally Gopamma also developed as a leader.

She is grateful to ORBIT and SHG members for everything, especially for empowering her to become a political leader to serve the village.

### **COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION (CBR)**

CBR Program for the differently abled covers 69 DPOs and 5 Taluk Federations of Bidar district in Karnataka aiming at their social inclusion and mainstreaming.

- To integrate differently abled persons into the mainstream of the society
- To help people with disabilities by establishing Community Based Rehabilitation programs for social integration, equalization of opportunities and rehabilitation.
- To empower the differently abled persons by giving them guidance and awareness to make it work as a double edged sword in changing the mindset of the public and the differently abled as well.

## Case study:1 Rescued to the Freedom of a Child



6<sup>th</sup> February 2020 is an unforgettable day in the life of 15 years old young Sashi (name changed). It was supposed to be the most important and dark day in her life if her marriage had taken place as scheduled..... But it turned out to be a day of new beginning in her life. Thanks to Child line team for their active presence in the Taluk, creating awareness on child rights and the violations.

Child line was informed on 6.2.2020 at 9.30 am about a child marriage being taking place at 11.30 am in one of the villages of Humnabad Taluk. Child

line team rushed to the village and verified. The team collected the details about the child, visiting the school where she studied. The documents of the child was verified and found that the child was only 15 years old. She was a 9<sup>th</sup> standard student of the Govt. High School in the locality. The teachers confessed that Sashi was a bright student and topper of the class and active in extracurricular activities. She used to be regular to her class. Yet they did not take any steps to find out the reason when she was absent from the class for the last two weeks and Sashi's house being close to the school. The teachers assumed that she was sick or gone to some relatives' house.

On further enquiry, Child line team found that Sashi hails from a poor Scheduled Caste family. Her parents are coolie workers. She has two younger brothers. Her father is an alcoholic and used to pick up fight with her mother and the people in the neighbourhood when he is drunk. There was no peace at home. Being a poor family and having such a bad reputation in the village, her mother was afraid that Sashi will not get a good proposal. So she arranged Sashi's marriage with the neighbour who was 30 years old.

With the documental evidence collected, the Child line team immediately informed the Child Welfare Committee and other Child Marriage Prevention Officers (CMPOs) about the Child Marriage. The officials rushed to the spot and stopped the marriage. Awareness on the physical and psychological ill-effects of child marriage on the girl was created to the family and neighbours. Child marriage being a criminal offence, the legal consequences was explained. The parents gave written agreement not to conduct the marriage until the girl is major.

Child line team is following up the case. The child resumed her studies and appeared for her 9<sup>th</sup> standard exams. Presently she is promoted to 10<sup>th</sup> standard.

## Case study: 2 Young shoulders freed from the burden of hard labour

Rahim Khan, son of Mohammed and Shahana Begam is just 14 years old. (names are changed)

He lives with his parents in a village in Humnabad taluk. He has two brothers and one sister. Father is an agricultural coolie worker. Agricultural labour is seasonal and depends on the monsoon and type of crops cultivated. So he is unable to earn a regular income. He gets Rs. 400/- per day whenever there is work. Mother earns Rs. 600/- per month as a domestic worker after her own household works. His elder brother works as an auto driver in Hyderabad who never cared for the family. The family is very poor, and the life was hard for Rahim who was studying in 8<sup>th</sup> standard. He was not having note books; he was unable to pay the contributions for various celebrations demanded by the teacher. He could not cope with school life when the teacher scolded and beat him for various

reasons. Finally, Rahim dropped out from school and refused to go to school though his parents persuaded him much.

Due to the financial crisis, the father sent the son for work in Rahmath Hotel in Humnabad from 16.05.19 onwards for the wages of 150 rupees per day. Rahim worked from morning 8 am till evening 7 p.m with one meal from the hotel. Child help line 1098



received a call from a person who noticed the child working in the hotel on 10.09.2019.

Immediately, the child line ORBIT staff visited the spot as per the information received and found the child working. The staff spoke to the hotel owner and created awareness regarding the child labour and the punishment with regard to engaging child labour. The child was rescued and left at home. The parents were also given awareness regarding the child labour and its consequence.

After a few days one of the Childline staff noticed that the same child was working in the same hotel. So the Childline staff informed the officials such as police, DCPO, PSI, TMC, and Labour department. Together with the officials, the child line team visited the hotel and the child was rescued on 02.11.19. Strict warning was given to the hotel management.

The child has been readmitted in Govt. Higher Primary school in the village. Rahim goes to the school happily. And it was also informed that the elder brother of the child also began to help the family now. So the family lives a happy life.

## **WOMEN IN MICRO ENTERPRISE**

In collaboration with SAMRUDI of KROSS, Bangalore, the program is organized by ORBIT in Bidar, Balki, Basavakalyan and Aurad taluks of Bidar district. Members of democratically governed women's organizations own and control SAMRUDI. The program envisages creating entrepreneurs among rural women to improve the standard of living of their families.

- Provide technical support and promote entrepreneurs among rural women
- Support women financially to raise their monthly individual income

## SUCCESS STORY: 1

### Life built up with the help of SHG & Samrudhi loan

Shantamma W/o Shankar is a 60 Years old member of Varalaxmi SHG. Her life saga of past 18 years is a big success story of hard work. She belonged to a very poor family of Scheduled Caste in Hunaji village of Bhalki Taluq. She has four daughters and two sons. Her husband Shankar is an agricultural labourer and his income is seasonal. Following his traditional occupation, Shankar also goes for playing band set for weddings and drumming the announcements in the village. But his income was insufficient for him to support the family as he used to be a drunkard and spent the money on liquor. Shantamma also used go for coolie work to sustain the family as her husband was irresponsible. Both of them are illiterates. They did not have any land or property. The family lived in a small hut.



ORBIT staff formed Varalaxmi SHG in Hunaji village in 2003. Shanthamma joined the SHG and tried to save small amounts from her limited income like Rs. 5, 10 and 20. The other members of the SHG felt compassion for Shanthamma's miserable life and they encouraged her to build a house.

Shanthamma struggled to meet the expenses of her family with her limited income from the seasonal work. She could not educate all her children after supporting all other needs of the family such as food, clothing, medicine, etc. Only three of her children went to school. One son studied up to PUC, another son up to 7<sup>th</sup> standard and a daughter up to SSLC. She used to observe her companions collecting grass after the day's work for the cattle. It was an additional income for them.

Shanthamma was inspired by this and wished if she too could rear a buffalo to support her income. But finance was her hurdle. So she was excited to hear about the EDP training organized by ORBIT to support the entrepreneurs. She attended the training and received the Samrudhi loan Rs. 25,000/-. An additional loan of Rs. 15,000/- was taken from the SHG and she brought a buffalo. Her income increased by 200-300 per day from selling the milk. She bought another buffalo too. The health of the family members improved with the improved income as well as availability of milk products in the family. Her husband also began to support the family.

Since 2014, the family began to construct their house, little by little with their savings, loan and hard work. It took four years for them to complete the house. Today they own a beautiful spacious house. Though she was unable to educate her children, Shanthamma got her daughters settled. Sons began to work. They learned driving. They bought a car and run taxi service with it. She had to sell the buffaloes to settle the daughter and for house construction.

Shanthamma and family are very grateful to ORBIT and Samrudhi for the strong support in the neediest time of their life.

## **Success story: 2**

Vinodamma is a widow from Halahalli village of Hulsoor taluq. She is a 52 year old illiterate woman. Vinodamma became widow in her young age and she worked hard to bring up her three children. She educated them and settled them in life. She has a small house and a flour mill and she supported her family with the income from the flour mill.

Presently, the eldest son Bharath works as water supply man in the village; the second son Ganesh completed his education last year and began to work as electrician and the daughter is married.

She joined Sree Laxmi SHG under ORBIT, a few years ago. Vinodamma is an active member of Sree Laxmi SHG. The SHG meeting is conducted in her house. Though she is not an office bearer, she takes a lot of interest for the growth of their SHG without counting the cost. She is a hard working and generous woman. Both the sons are very cooperative with mother.

ORBIT gave various trainings for this SHG and among them was EDP training under Samrudhi project. Vinodamma used to borrow loan from private financiers for high interest whenever she was in financial crisis. The loan offered by Samrudhi project for the entrepreneurship development after EDP training was a boon for her to develop her flour mill. She took Rs. 15,000 loan for the first time and repaid the loan without any default. She took the second loan for Rs. 25,000 and completed it in 20 installments.

She is happy with this loan since the interest is comparatively less and it brings more profit for her. According to Vinodamma, her profit has increased from 2000 to 4000 since she has taken the Samrudhi loan. In her absence, her daughter in law manages the flour mill.



She is grateful to ORBIT for forming the SHG in her village and empowering the women through various trainings. She is particularly thankful to the organization for the economic empowerment through entrepreneurship development with the support of low interest loan.

### **NAVAJEEVANA: Community Based Rehabilitation of Persons with Mental Illness**



This new programme for the integration of People with Mental Illness was launched by the end of June 2019. A Baseline survey on the attitudes of people towards mental illness and persons with mental illness was conducted at the outset. 300 persons from various strata of society were interviewed. 90 PwMIs were identified and 75 PwMIs were linked to free medical camps under District Mental Health Programme (DMHP) for

treatment & free medication. The patients and their families (Care takers) are followed up for regular medication.

The PwMIs/Care takers are formed into DPOs for social reintegration.

### **Skill Development and Income Generation Program (SDIGP)**

In order to empower the youth and women who are unemployed and unskilled, ORBIT organizes skill development programmes on Driving, Garment Making/ Tailoring, Rexene Bag making, Beautician, Paper bag making, Basic computer etc.

#### **Objectives:**

- To improve the livelihood security.
- Enhanced productivity of vulnerable and backward communities by developing skills and assets.
- Promoting greater income generation and vocational training opportunities.
- Promotion of micro credit units to promote the business and growth.
- Empowering people to self manage and run their own livelihood with their own capabilities.

ORBIT has given focus to the skill development of rural women and youth in various villages of all seven Taluqs of Bidar District, during the year 2019-20. Total 210 persons were given skill development training. Along with the skill trainings, the trainees were given additional input sessions on various life skills such as RTI Act, etiquette, Gender Sensitivity, health & hygiene, HIV/AIDS, Communication, leadership, Child Rights, etc. besides the Entrepreneurship Development workshop.

### Success Story: A Dream fulfilled & a Better Future Opened

19 year old Sandeep is the eldest son of Devendra and Christhakumari from Khashampur. He has a younger sister who has completed her SSLC. He studied upto 7<sup>th</sup> standard. His parents are poor coolie workers. Father is a wood cutter who earns Rs. 300/ per day whenever he gets work which is seasonal. He gets work mostly in summer season. Mother gets occasional work in agricultural sector during monsoon season and with a wages Rs. 100/-

They have a small two room - house with tinned roof and half acre dry land. Due to poverty, Sandeep dropped out from school and went for odd jobs to support the family. He used to get Rs.100 whenever he got work. Meanwhile the opportunity to learn driving was opened to him when ORBIT conducted the Driving training at Ujini and the local director encouraged him to make use of the opportunity.

He completed the training and got Learner's License successfully. Soon after the course, the nation went into lock down due to the pandemic COVID - 19. Sandeep was able to get employed immediately as driver of auto rickshaw in his village Khashampur during the four months of lock down and earned an average Rs. 6,000/- per month. It was a great experience for Sandeep to earn such an amount in such a critical time to support his family. Later on, the owner of the auto rickshaw recommended him to his relative who has a water supply agency. He started his work as driver of water tanker with a salary of Rs. 10,000/- per month since July 2020. He got his driving license late in December due to the lock down and delays in the R T office.

Sandeep bought a second hand Goods Carrier truck with a loan from Private financier. ORBIT director motivated and encouraged Sandeep to appear for his SSLC through Open School. Sandeep is very much interested to do it now as he needs SSLC certificate to get job as Ambulance driver in Hyderabad.

e is extremely grateful to ORBIT for the opportunity to master the skill he dreamed for always and the soft skills which enabled him to develop his personality.





## Beauty of Rainbow in life



**Mera** from Nandgaon village in Humnabad Taluk completed her four months Beautician training under Skill development Prigramme organized by ORBIT in January 2020. She, along with her co- trainee, Shrungarani started a beauty parlour at Humnabad city in March. As the enterprise began to pick up momentum and the number of customers began to increase, the unpredicted COVID 19 lock down hit the area.

Mera is a 26 year old young widow with two children... of nine years and eight years. Her 9 years old daughter is a differently abled (70% deaf and dumb) child. It was identified lately, a year ago, when the child was facing a lot of problem in coping with her studies in the school. Mera studied up to 6<sup>th</sup> standard. She was “wed-locked” in child marriage when she was 16 years old, to a young man of 21 years at Chondi village, Bidar. He was a drunkard and the marriage lasted for just four years as he died of liver cirrhosis. Mera was granted the widowhood at the age of 20... She stayed in her husband’s family for two more years. By then her father in law died and her mother in law was unwilling to carry the ‘burden’ further. Mera returned to her parental home with her little ones, four years ago.

Her parents are coolie workers. They own a small house alone. She has a younger sister to be settled. She joined her parents for coolie work and tried to find means to sustain her children.

She joined with all her enthusiasm for the beautician course when it was conducted by ORBIT at Humnabad. She mastered the skill well. The EDP training and personal counselling enabled her to gain self-confidence to launch her own enterprise. The initial investment was the greatest block before her. She discussed with her companion Ms. Shrungarani and decided to make it as a joint venture. They drew loans from the SHGs in which they are members. ORBIT too extended a limited assistance. Finally their dream was realized when they could hire a room in Humnabad city and inaugurate the beauty parlour. They mobilized Rs. 60,000/- from SHG loan and other sources. They rented a room in Humnabad city for Rs. 30,000/- for a year. An advance of Rs. 20,000/- was paid and rearranged the room; bought all equipments, cosmetics and other accessories and launched the beauty parlour named Honeyshree in the second week of March 2020. Just after a week of the inauguration of the parlour, as the customers began to come, the country went into abrupt lock down due to the pandemic COVID - 19.

Though the COVID-19 once again locked up her dreams, she reopened the parlour as soon as the Lock down was lifted. But once again they had to shut down due to COVID case next door. Since the third week, of August 2020 the parlour is reopened once again.

They get customers in an irregular basis and an average of Rs. 500/- per day.

Mere also began to try the saree boutique work by looking at You tube. Whenever there is no customer, she does it and earns an additional income of Rs. 250 to Rs. 1,000/-

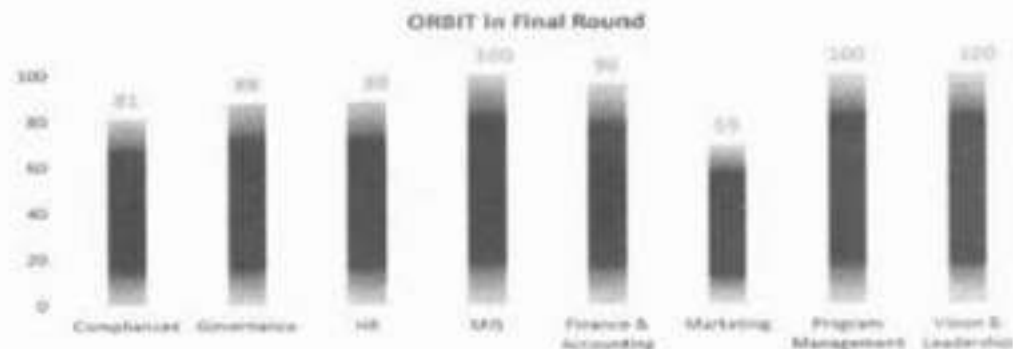

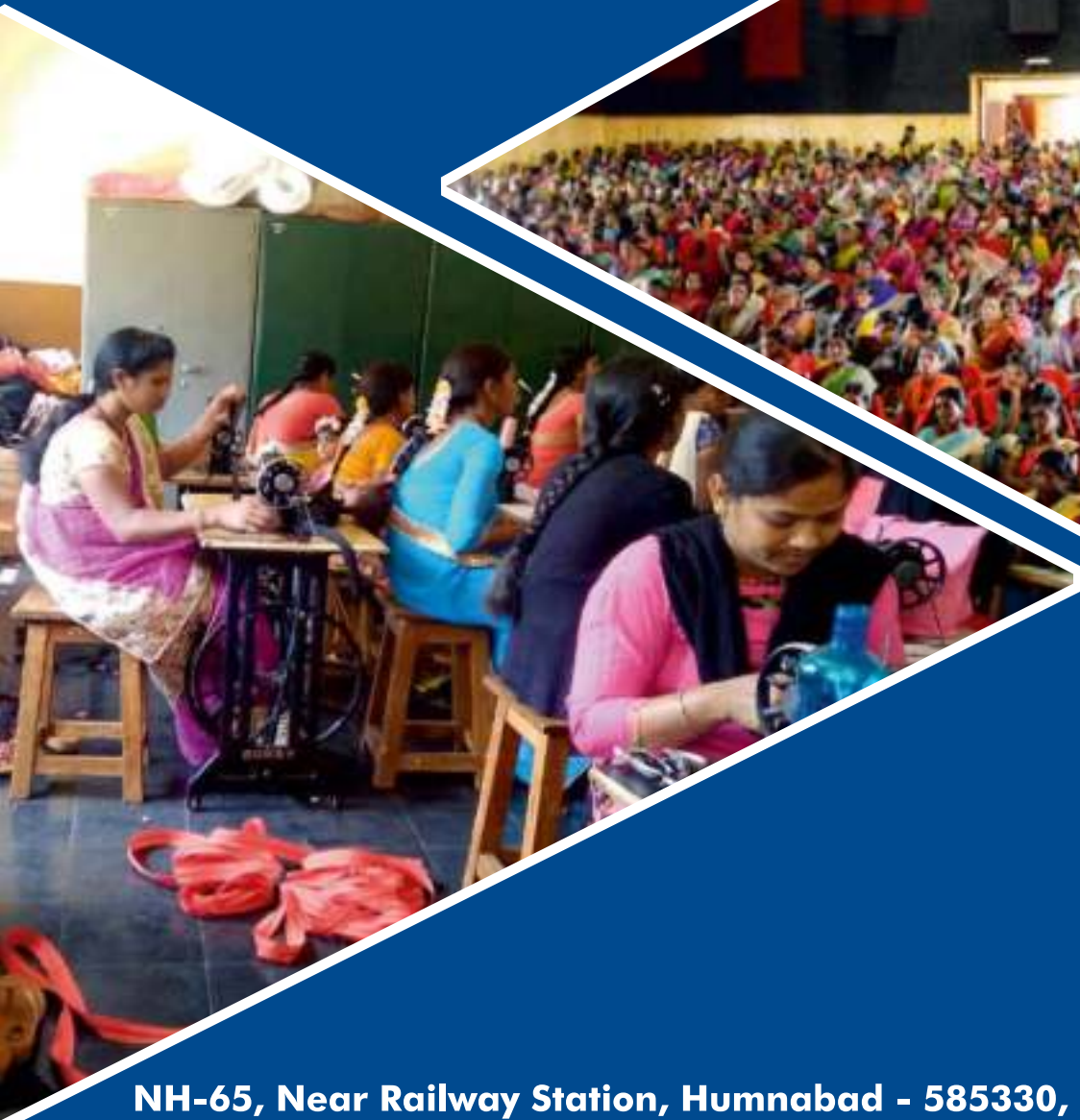
